

Introduction

The library is not just a physical space but a gateway to knowledge, a catalyst for intellectual growth, and a vital component of the college community. It serves as a beacon of learning; connecting students, faculty, and researchers with the information they seek, contributing to the academic excellence and success of the college as a whole.



Brief Background and Foundation

Since the inception (1963), Bhatter College, Dantan has a rich library, namely *Vidyasagar Central Library*. With time it blossoms quantitatively and qualitatively with its documentary resources, services and human resources. The Central Library has developed computer based information storage and retrieval system in multi user environment and more than 20000 valuable resources are digitized with SOUL 2.0 Integrated Library Management Software in 2014 with the following objectives;

- to develop a comprehensive database of users and resources
- to develop a fully automated catalogue search system
- to develop a fully automated barcode-based circulation system

But to fit with the rapid change of information searching behaviour of the users and to improve the service quality, the Library sub-committee decided to shift from SOUL to Koha ILMS in 2021. The cloud based Integrated Library Management System (Koha) not only provides the OPAC searching facility, renewal facility and personalized profile monitoring facility from their home, but also helps to maintain the COVID protocols in the pandemic situation. At present almost all the modern services are provided and intended to be provided the rests in the anticipatory future. It assists to strengthen the excellence of Teaching-Learning process. *Vidyasagar Central Library* is one of the central facilities used by all types of members of this institution.

Personal Belongings/ Janitor's counter

There is Janitor's counter at the main entrance of the Central Library. 


General Rules

- Maintain strict silence in the Reading Room and other areas of the Central Library
- 2) Students from all disciplines must bring ID cum Library card when entering Central Library
- 3) DO NOT enter with your baggage, but deposit the same at the entrance counter
- 4) Mobile, wallet and other precious things keep to yourself
- 5) After borrowing a book from Lending Counter, one PRINTED GATE-PASS will be given to you. DO NOT FORGET to submit the same at Janitor's Counter on leaving the library
- 6) After taking a book from Reading Room shelf, make it issued at the Reading Room Counter.
- 7) Students will be allowed to take maximum three books at a time for study in the Reading Room and two books for home
- 8) The single copy book, reference books and periodicals (both journals and magazines) are meant for consultation WITHIN READING ROOM ONLY and strictly NOT TO BE LENT OUT
- 9) DO NOT make chaotic crowd in front of any counter, but stand systematically in queue
- 10) The book borrowed by the students should be returned on or before the stipulated date mentioned on date-slip
- 11) The photocopy section is for LIBRARY BOOKS ONLY. The class notes, outside papers and outside books are strictly NOT TO BE PHOTOCOPIED HERE
- 12) Do not scatter the pages of newspaper when reading



- 13) Check the condition of the book at the time of borrowing. If any mutilation found, report instantly the concerned library staff. Otherwise the borrower will be responsible for the damage
- 14) For renewal of books, if students don't able to come physically to the Library, are asked to send their (1) College ID and (2) Accession No. of the book to be reissued to the following email-address: library.bcd@gmail.com.



- 15) Keep your mobile in silent mode.
- 16) Central Library offer the hybrid access system; Open Access for Teachers and Close Access for Students
- 17) To go to the stack room, permission of the Librarian is needed for students
- 18) DO NOT misplace books while selecting on the shelves. After consulting books DO NOT shuffle, but keep in proper place.
- 19) You can use CD-ROM, DVD-ROM and/or Pendrive in the library computers, but ensure that the same is free from virus.
- 20) The Laptops and Palmtops are allowed in the library, but CHARGING of the same is NOT ALLOWED. Bring your devices in full charged mode
- 21) Scan the library notice boards regularly (Outside the library premise)
- 22) The library card is NOT TRANSFERRABLE
- 23) In any kind of library related queries, problems, suggestion, feel free to contact with Librarian

Concept of Call Number and its Importance in Retrieval

The Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) system is used throughout to build up the call numbers of the books. The call numbers consist of two parts. The three-digit number represents the first part, which is the subject-indicator of the book. Also, an



alphabetic combination represents the last part, which is the author- and title-indicator of the book. An outline of the Dewey Decimal Classification is given below. The broad disciplines indicated by the starting digits of the first parts of the call numbers along with the subjects covered under each discipline are summarized in Table 1. Also, the class numbers of some subjects are listed in Table 2 for the convenience of teachers and students, where the subject names are arranged in alphabetic order. A book is located on shelf by its call number [Class no. + Book no.]. After having a thorough look on Table 1 and 2 you can promptly retrieve the book you require from the library shelves.


Call number consists with three parts:

- 1) Location indicator
- 2) Class number
- 3) Book number

The book number also consists of two parts:

- 1) Author indicator
- 2) Title indicator

On-line Public Access Catalogue (OPAC)

Well-customized Web-OPAC facility is now offered seamlessly for 24*7 hours, also from off-campus. The Web-OPAC helps to save the time of the user and also helps to maintain the COVID – protocols by avoiding the rushes in the Searching-Section of Library. Students can search the bibliographic details independently by author, subject, call no, key-word, title etc. from their handheld devices. Add to cart, Boolean search, limiting search, favourite list, search history, purchase suggestion, feedback, talk to librarian, reissue, dashboard view, place holding facility and so on are offered by it. Current Awareness Service (CAS) has also been provided by the Web-OPAC of KOHA ILMS.

The OPAC allows search by authors, title, subject and title keywords as well as through several other access points. You can search through "Simple search" and "Advance search" to locate a particular book in the library. To browse the comprehensive list of collection on a particular domain you can click on "Browse" button. At the "Browsing" screen you can go to "Database" panel to see the comprehensive list of books. Click on "Journals" button to find out the comprehensive list of journals and magazines.

Some points to be remembered:


- To start searching a particular book by author, type author's <u>SURNAME FIRST</u>, then put a COMMA (,), then type a <u>SINGLE SPACE</u> and lastly type author's first name and middle name.
- To start searching a particular book by title, put the articles (A), (AN), (THE) within first braquette ().
- To start searching by title's single keyword, go to SIMPLE SEARCH.
- ➤ To start searching by title's multiple keywords, go to ADVANCE SEARCH and insert appropriate Boolean connector AND/OR between two keywords.



How to Search Web-OPAC on Your Mobile



Directly open the link (https://bhattercollege-opac.kohacloud.in) or follow the following steps;






Bibliographic details of the book will appear. Collect a requisition form from Circulation Section of Central Library. Fill up this and submit to the Circulation Section and after few minutes get your desired resources.

Basic and Advance Search

Basic Search: In the OPAC, library patrons will see a search box at the top of most pages.



To search, enter a word or multiple words in the search box. When no search index is specified, a keyword search is performed.

Note: You can verify this by typing one word into the form and note the number of results. Then, repeat the search with a minor change: in front of the search word, type 'kw=' followed by the same search term. The results will be identical.


When you have more than one word in the search box, Koha will still do a keyword search, but with the Boolean operator 'AND'. This will narrow your search to only records matching all the words.



When searching, select the major terms of what you are looking for and enter them into the persistent search box.



Koha will perform the search and return the results.






Advanced Search

Advanced search can help when the basic search returns too many results.

Get there: Search or Advanced search

The advanced search form offers many ways to limit the results of your search. You can search using the Boolean operators AND, OR, and NOT; limit by item type; limit by year and language; limit by subtypes audience, content, format, or additional content types; by location and by availability.


You can use as many sections as you need, none are mandatory, as long as there is at least one search term or one limit selected.

Printed Card-Catalogue (Discontinued from 2015)

There is author/title/subject catalogue for books in English and other European languages. For Indian languages like Bengali and Sanskrit there are similar catalogues. In order to find out books in these languages the above mentioned transliteration code should be followed to ensure instant retrieval of requisite information.

The main guide to locate book in the Library is the author-title-subject catalogue. In these catalogues the entries of the cards are arranged under the names of the authors/editors/translators/compilers/title and subject for every book in the library. Corporate bodies, societies, institutions, Govt. bodies are regarded as authors of the works published by them. All the card entries (authors/editors/translators/compilers/title/subject) in the Author catalogue are arranged in alphabetical order as in a dictionary. In the subject catalogue, the card entries are arranged under the subject-headings in alphabetical order for each book. Similarly, in a title catalogue, the card entries are arranged under the titles in alphabetical order for each book.

One specimen catalogue card along with its different components is shown in the box below. The top left alphanumeric code is known as call number, which consists of three parts as described earlier.

Location Indicator

The Location indicator will tell you the section to which the concerned book belongs to. The explanation of location indicators are shown in following table. The first three indicators are functioning at present, while the last sixteen indicators will be used later on for the departmental libraries.

The class number will tell you the subject area to which the concerned book belongs to. The book number consists of two parts. The first part, author indicator encompasses first three alphabets of the author's surname, while the second part, title indicator contains the first three alphabets of the title of the book excluding article, i.e. (A), (An) and (The).

Visit the NDLI website. On the top right, click Log In. If you are already a member, enter your log in credentials to continue. If you are a new member, click Register. This opens a registration form where you can enter your details - including your name, email id and password. Once you have done this, NDLI sends an activation link for your account on your e-mail id. You can click on this link to become a member and browse content easily at home.







Different Searching Facilities

This is the first method to access content on NDLI. Search option helps to look for a particular item, with the option to refine the search by subject, author, source, or education level.

If you have a specific item in mind, you can look it up using the 'Search' option on the homepage. Type in a keyword for whatever you are looking for - a subject name, a topic name or may be a question paper for a particular Board - into the search box and hit Enter on the keyboard to get a list of Search results.








Refining Search



Advance Search

The Advanced Search option helps you to find your desired content in one go. You can enter a subject, a book's title or an author's name of your choice along with filters like Source, Educational Level, Language and Learning Resource Type to get a list of relevant search results.





Choosing these filters at one go will help to specify your search and thereby, narrow the search results. This is a great way of making the desired choices at one shot.
